- Must be able to read and write.
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- May not be a current employee of the school board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.

## *University of Rochester Award Nominees Announced*

Since 1933, the University of Rochester has maintained a tradition of helping high schools recognize their most talented students. The University of Rochester currently offers awards to recognize outstanding juniors in high school.

To be considered for these scholarships, students must first apply for admissions to the University. Upon application for admission, winners are automatically considered for the respective scholarship. The scholarship provides each qualified student \$7,500 to \$20,000 per year for four years. Selection for these scholarships is competitive and is based upon the overall strength of the student's application for admission.

Each year, more than 3,000 high schools from around the world participate in this award recognition program. Congratulations to our WHS nominees!

The U of R is proud to continue the tradition of the Bausch and Lomb Honorary Science Award, given each year to high school juniors who demonstrate exceptional promise in the sciences. Wellsville High School's nominee for the Bausch & Lomb Honorary Science Award is **Lily Norton**.

**Rachel Ellison** has been nominated by WHS to receive the University of Rochester's Humanities/Social Sciences Award. This award is named in honor of famous Rochester natives Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony. The University is proud

to continue the tradition of these pioneers through extensive research and study devoted to social justice and human rights.

Wellsville High School's third nominee is **Elizabeth Sobeck**. Elizabeth has been nominated for the George Eastman Young Leaders Award. Selection for this award is based upon strong leadership experience at school and in the community and extensive involvement in extracurricular activities.

# Beverly Sweet Selected for Summer Study in Japan

Wellsville High School Teacher **Beverly Sweet (at right)** is preparing for a four-week study tour in Japan. Mrs. Sweet will be joining 11 other world history educators from across the United States for the Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad (FHGPA) 2013 study tour to Japan. The tour is being sponsored by the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA) national coordinating site at the Program for Teaching East Asia (TEA), University of Colorado Boulder.



Mrs. Sweet was selected for the NCTA 2013 Japan Study Tour based on her previous study of Japan and her commitment to enhancing teaching about Japan. This spring, Mrs. Sweet will complete online course work to prepare for the summer program in Japan.

The Cultural Encounters: Japan's Diverse Past and Present NCTA FHGPA 2013 Japan Study Tour program was made possible through generous grants from the U.S. Department of Education's Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad program, the United States-Japan Foundation, and the Freeman Foundation. These institutions have dedicated their efforts to improving the quality of teaching about Asia in the nation's schools, with support from the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA) national coordinating site at the Program for Teaching East Asia (TEA) at the University of Colorado.

From June 24 through July 23, the group will travel to the cities of Tokyo, Fukuoka, Nagasaki, Nara, Kyoto, and Yokohama. During the program, the group will focus on understanding Japan's past and present through its encounters with peoples of East Asia, Europe, and the United States. The tour participants will tour historical sites; visit with teachers, students, and academic specialists; and participate in daily briefings.

### **More Important Information for Seniors (Class of 2013):**

- Complete your Senior Data Sheet carefully and neatly and return it to the Guidance Office by April 22.
- Neatness Counts! We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be scrupulously honest), and write legibly and neatly in black ink. The Senior Data Sheet is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.
- Scholarship Night is set for Tuesday, June 4. If you are going to receive an award, your parents or guardians will receive a letter. However, all seniors are encouraged to attend.

- Boys: When you turn 18, remember to register for Selective Service online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov).
- Please inform the Guidance Office of your post high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.
- Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.
- Please do not count on local scholarships to underwrite a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books and perhaps a small portion of tuition. You should already have a financial plan in place.
- Do your very best these last few months! Your senior year grades are important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.

### News for Juniors

Start doing college research now! Visit prospective colleges! There are many online services and the guidance office has many catalogs. Many scholarships given in the fall and spring of next year are based on your community service hours. Remember to complete your student activities form, update it when needed, and return it to the guidance office. Always do your best in your schoolwork! Your final three-year average will determine class rank, which is recorded on your high school transcript and is needed for college and scholarship applications during your senior year.
