


We are proud to announce that **Alyssa Kear (at LEFT)** has been chosen as the

Medal & Scholarship Program Winner

For many years, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, in conjunction with high schools around the country, has awarded the Rensselaer Medal to high school juniors who have distinguished themselves in mathematics and science. The RPI Medal in Science and Math has been awarded to **Austin Keib (at LEFT)**, a member of the Class of 2020.

The medal was first presented in 1916 with two purposes: to recognize the superlative academic achievement of young men and women, and to motivate students toward careers in science, engineering, and technology.

This \$25,000 per year merit scholarship is guaranteed for four years for each medalist who applies, is accepted, and chooses to enroll at Rensselaer. Rensselaer will be hosting an open house for all medalists in the fall.

Wellsville Secondary School will again be participating in RIT's High School Junior Awards Program. The Computing Medal and Scholarship Program and the Award for Creativity and Innovation not only recognize outstanding high school juniors, but also highlight RIT's leadership in computing education as well as its creative and innovative programs in many other disciplines. These range from engineering, sciences, and business to design, photography, film and crafts.

Loralai Crawford and Connor Majewski, Class of 2020, have been nominated for the Rochester Institute of Technology Computing Medal and Scholarship by Wellsville Secondary School Counselors and Administration. They have also nominated Sophie Majewski and Isaiah Scott to receive the RIT Creativity and Innovation Award.

Nominees for the awards program must rank in the top 10% of the junior class, demonstrate leadership in school and community, and be pursuing a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum. Students selected to receive these awards are eligible for a \$28,000 scholarship (\$7,000 per year) if accepted and enroll at RIT. Students may use these scholarships to pursue any of the baccalaureate degree programs available at RIT.





Proposition No. 3 -- Establishing a Capital Reserve

On the ballot, during the May Budget vote, is a proposition (#3) to allow the establishment of a capital reserve fund. The purpose of the reserve is to allow a means to save for an Athletic Pavilion. We would use this reserve to fund the local portion of the project, so the construction could occur without a tax impact. The current concession building, which has bathrooms, would be removed and be replaced with a viewing platform in its current location. A new athletic pavilion would be constructed near the current location, adjacent to the turf field's parking lot, and closer to the bleachers. The pavilion would house a concession area, locker rooms, bathrooms, and athletic storage. The new pavilion, including the bathrooms, would be ADA compliant providing for wheelchair accessibility.

A separate public vote would occur to authorize the construction and to make payments from the proposed capital reserve. The maximum amount of the reserve would be capped at \$1.1 million dollars.



Clarkson Leadership & Achievement Awards

Clarkson University would once again like to recognize two top juniors. The CU Achievement Award has been awarded to **Anthony Billings**. The CU Leadership Award has been awarded to **Jarek Shea**. The juniors selected for the Clarkson Leadership and Clarkson Achievement Awards will qualify for a \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year) or \$48,000 (\$12,000 per year) tuition scholarship, respectively, over four years should the students apply, be accepted and choose to enroll at Clarkson University.

To be eligible for the Clarkson Leadership Award or Clarkson Achievement Award, the juniors must be recognized by students and faculty as having been a positive contributor to school and community, demonstrate leadership qualities, be enrolled in a college-bound program and achieve an academic class rank in the top 15%.






