### COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL DATA

Wellsville is a village of approximately 7,000 people in southwestern New York State, 86 miles south of Rochester. It is the largest town in rural Allegany County. SUNY Alfred College of Technology, Alfred University, SUNY College of Ceramics, Houghton College and St. Bonaventure University are nearby. The SUNY Alfred Technology campus is located in Wellsville.

The comprehensive public high school serves approximately 400 students in Grades 9-12. The school is approved and accredited by the University of the State of New York. Grade 12 enrollment for 2022-2023 is approximately 95.

### GRADING

The 2-day cycle is scheduled on a system of 42 minute periods which meet everyday. Grades are distributed four times during the 40-week school year. A 100 point numerical grading system is used with 65% the minimum passing grade. The lowest grade given during the first quarter is 55%. Final grades are the average of the four grading periods and the final examination. Advanced Placement, Honors' and College Courses are weighted an additional 5% on the transcript.

### CLASS RANK

After completing the junior year (and following summer school) all seniors are ranked. Rank is based on the final grade average in all credit subjects. Also included are accelerated courses completed for credit prior to Grade 9 (Math and Foreign Language).

### CURRICULUM

Academic course offerings include 5 credits of Spanish, 5 credits of Social Studies including, AP American History, AP Economics, Psychology; 5 credits of English including AP English, College English Composition, College English Literature; 5 credits of Mathematics including Calculus 1, Calculus II, Pre-Calculus, College Algebra, and Elementary Statistics; and 5 credits of Science, Forensic Science, Fish & Wildlife Conservation, Anatomy & Physiology & College Biology. Electives include courses in Art, Business, Music, and Technology. Vocational training in 15 subject areas are offered through the Career & Tech Center in Belmont, NY and Building Trades Science Program at Genesee Valley Central School. The New Vision Health Professions Program and the New Visions Education Careers Program are elective programs for high school seniors who plan to attend college and major in a health related field or education related field. Upon successful completion of the program students will receive credits from Jamestown Community College.

Alfred State College – English Composition (3 credit hrs.) & English Literature (3 credit hrs.)

Jamestown Community College – Intro. to Psychology (3 credit hrs.)

Jamestown Community College – Accounting (3 credit hrs.)

SUNY Albany – Spanish IV (3 credit hrs.) & Spanish V (3 credit hrs.)

Alfred University – College Biology (8 credit hrs. w/labs)

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students need 22 1/2 units to graduate. All students must complete: 4 units of English, 4 units of social studies, 3 units of math, 3 units of science, 1 unit of a foreign language, 1 unit of art or music, a half unit of health, and 2 units of physical education, in addition to electives. Additional requirements are needed for an Advanced Regents diploma. A passing grade on a senior research paper is also required of graduates.
