Schedule and Grading

- For the Class of 2024, Advanced

Wellsville is a village of approximately 7,000 people in southwestern New York State, 86 miles south of Rochester. It is the largest town in rural Allegany County. SUNY Alfred College of Technology, Alfred University, SUNY College of Ceramics, Houghton College, and St. Bonaventure University are nearby. The SUNY Alfred Technology campus is located in Wellsville.

The comprehensive public high school serves approximately 400 students in Grades 9-12. The school is approved and accredited by the University of the State of New York. Grade 12 enrollment for 2023-2024 is approximately 95.
