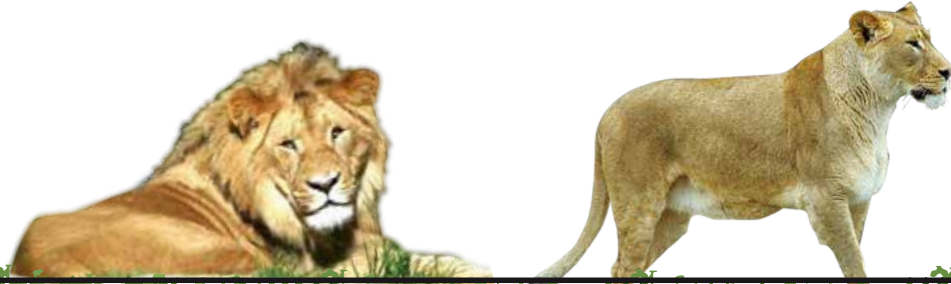

## Important Reminder to Seniors & Parents

If you have any questions concerning these sheets, please see guidance.

### More Important Information for Seniors (Class of 2021)

- Complete your Senior Data Sheet carefully and neatly and return it to the Guidance Office by April 26th.
- Neatness Counts! We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be scrupulously honest), and write legibly and neatly in black ink. The Senior Data Sheet is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.
- Boys: When you turn 18, remember to register for Selective Service online at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov)
- Please inform the Guidance Office of your post high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.
- Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.
- Please do not count on local scholarships to underwrite a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books and perhaps a small portion of tuition. You should already have a financial plan in place.
- Do your very best these last few months! Your senior year grades are important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.



## News for Juniors

Start doing college research now! Visit prospective colleges! Many scholarships given in the fall and spring of next year are based on your community service hours. Remember to complete your student activities form, update it when needed and return it to the guidance office. Always do your best in your schoolwork! Your final three-year average will determine class rank, which is recorded on your high school transcript and needed for college and scholarship applications during your senior year.

### **Elmira College Key Award**

WSS is proud to announce the recipients of the Elmira College Key Award, from the Class of 2022, they are Marley Adams and Ellie LaBenne. The Key Award, sponsored by the Elmira College Alumni Association, has been awarded to fine students since 1935. The award of merit is presented to outstanding high school juniors in the top of their class with a minimum cumulative average of 90%. Candidates must also demonstrate school and community leadership.

A Key Award winner receives an \$80,000 tuition scholarship over a four-year period, \$20,000 per year, upon enrolling at Elmira College. The award is renewable each year with an academic average of 3.0 or higher. Recipients attending Elmira College are also honored in the fall of their freshman year by the Alumni Association and are presented with the prestigious Elmira College Key.



### **Sage Awards Announced**

Kaylee Coleman and Izabel Culbertson, Class of 2022, have been named the "Student Sage" from Wellsville Secondary School. The "Student Sage Award" enables high schools to honor juniors from their school community with this nomination. Recipients of the award will receive a certificate of nomination and an invitation to The Sage College Student Sage Scholars' Reception during his/her senior year. Upon admission, the student nominees will be eligible for a scholarship to Russell Sage College. Confirmed nominees will receive a scholarship of at least \$10,000 per year to attend Sage College.

### **Wells College 21st Century Leadership Award Announced**

Recognizing the need for ethical leadership, Wells College presents the 21st Century Leadership Award to high school juniors who demonstrate leadership ability in high school and community activities and exhibit academic excellence. Recipients are nominated by their school counselor and the administration in the spring of their junior year and are then recognized by the Admissions Committee. The 21st Century Leadership Award program is designed to honor these students and grant them a \$40,000 Scholarship for Leaders (\$10,000 per year) for four years of study at Wells College.

The nominees must carry a cumulative average of at least 90% throughout high school. Wellsville Secondary School nominates Natalie Infrerra and Hannah Sturm, to receive the 21st Century Leadership Award at Wells College.



## Keuka College Community Achievement Awards

Keuka College is proud to present The George H. Ball Community Achievement Award to Emily Costello, Kylie Fanton-Acker, Cameron Gordon, Dalton Ketchner, and Delaney Wonderling. The scholarship is named after Rev. ## **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

Absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk, Dawn Youmans, at 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY at least seven days before the date of the budget vote (May 18, 2021) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the budget vote if the ballot is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots may not be mailed by the District Clerk earlier than 30 days before the vote. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the budget vote (May 18, 2021).

Military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the School District, if they meet the criteria for same. Military voters, as defined by Education Law 2018-d, may request an application to register as a qualified voter from the District Clerk. Military voter registration application forms must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the twenty-sixth (26th) day before the election (May 18, 2021). A military voter may designate a preference to receive a military voter registration, military ballot application or military ballot by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail in their request for such registration, ballot application, or ballot. Such designation shall remain in effect until revoked or changed by the military voter.

## **Three Vacancies on the Board of Education**

The Wellsville Central School Board of Education announces three school board vacancies expiring on June 30, 2021. These vacancies are for three-year terms and will expire June 30, 2024. Anyone interested in running for the school board can pick up a petition at the District Office located in the Secondary School Complex at 126 West State Street in Wellsville. The petition requires signatures of twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district, and must be filed with the District Clerk at least thirty (30) days prior to the budget vote on May 18, 2021. The last day petitions can be accepted is April 19, 2021. Please direct any questions you may have to Dawn Youmans, District Clerk, at 596-2170.

To qualify for membership on the school board, the following conditions must be met:

- Must be able to read and write.
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- May not be a current employee of the school board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.

Throughout the month of February, the PE classes have been working hard to raise donations and awareness for The American Heart Association by participating in the Kids Heart Challenge. There are two goals of the program. The first is to raise money to assist children who have serious heart-related medical conditions. ## Secondary School Transitions to Increased In-Person Instruction

The Secondary School is happy to report that starting Monday, March 29th, we will be transitioning to increased in-person instruction for students in grades 7-12. We are excited to be able to transition to a more normal school experience. This year has been challenging, and students are excited to be back in school to see their teachers and their friends. Throughout this transition, the safety of students and staff remains vitally important. We will continue to maintain safeguards and follow recommended guidelines, such as wearing masks, social distancing, handwashing, and sanitizing desks. We will continue to provide updates as the situation changes throughout the spring and into the summer.

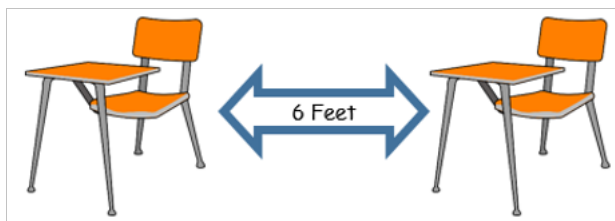
*Here are some of the highlights of the transition plan:*

### What has Changed

- Grades 7-12 students will transition to 4 days of in-person instruction each week starting on Monday, March 29, 2021. During this transition, Wednesdays remain a remote learning day with students in grades 7-12 connecting to classes via Zoom as they follow their daily schedule. The at-home learning days for team Wellsville and team Lions students are no longer in effect.

### Overflow Rooms, Capacity and Scheduling

- During this transition, student social distancing in classrooms remains in effect. This has caused some class sections to be over-capacity and in order to accommodate for this, we have created a plan for student overflow. A student in an overflow room will connect to his/her class via Zoom on a rotating basis, while being supervised in another teacher's classroom. Many class periods will not have any overflow, so this will be a significant increase in student in-person instructional time. We anticipate that the majority of a student's day will be in-person and students will not be Zooming into classes for the entire day.



### Remote learning

- Remote learning will still be an option for families during this transition. A significant change will be for students in grades 7-12 where they will be expected to connect to their classes via Zoom five days a week according to their schedule. A student who is on team Remote may return to in-person learning by calling the Secondary School Office for more information.

### Mornings and Afternoons

- The school building will open at 7:30 a.m. starting on March 29, 2021. Dismissal remains at 2:25 p.m. The parent drop-off for students in grades 6-8 will continue to be in the back parent drop-off loop. The parent drop-off for students in grades 9-12 will be in the West State Street pull-off area. This is a change for 9th grade students. If you have students in both 6th-8th grade and 9th-12th grade, you can choose one location that works best for you. No drop-offs should happen in the school parking lots.

## ***Theatre Is Back!***

(In a Socially Distanced and Totally COVID Compliant Kind of Way)

### **Part 1: What To Do?**

Our teenagers are sick (no pun intended) of sitting in their rooms with nothing to do; being on stage could provide an escape. And watching live theatre gives everyone a break from the same old routine to avoid going stir crazy. But how can we do theatre and meet the demands of the COVID guidelines? That was the question we faced when we began thinking about having a performance this spring. The solution, we decided, is a slate of one-act plays we are calling “202(1 Acts): Theatre Is the Best Medicine!” We picked 12 short vignettes that feature from 1 to 5 characters each. These scenes were selected to ensure social distancing and limited contact between cast members throughout the rehearsal process, as well as to allow for as many students to be involved as possible.

### **Part 2: How to Do It?**

The show was designed and auditions were held during the first week of February. Seventeen students—an awe-some number—auditioned for roles, and everyone was given a part (or two or three or four)! Since February Break, students have been rehearsing their scenes one at a time to minimize contact. Masks are worn when distance can’t be maintained and students are moved around the stage in such a way as to stay separated from one another. Sets and props are minimal in order to avoid having cast members touch the same items. The rehearsal process has moved forward and April break quickly approaches.

### **Part 3: How to Perform It?**

The performances are scheduled for Friday and Saturday, April 23rd & 24th, at 7:30 pm, and on Sunday, April 25th at 2:00pm. But how do we have an audience with COVID constraints? The solution is twofold. A limited live audience will be permitted in the auditorium—friends and family of the actors; each cast member will be allowed 3 seats for each performance, with tickets costing \$7 for children and senior citizens, \$8 for general admission. In addition to this, the three performances will be live streamed so others in the community and family members who can’t make it to the shows can also see our production. Those watching it on the live stream will have to purchase admission for \$5. Anyone in the community who would like to view the performance from home must contact Diane Willard, the show’s producer, to obtain admission to the live stream. ### **Part 4: What Will You See?**

The bulk of the one acts in our show were taken from Robert Fulghum’s *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*. These scenes include “The Briefcase,” “Problems and Inconveniences,” “Beethoven,” “Larry Walters Flies,” “Spider,” “Hide & Seek,” “Pigeons,” “MOTB,” and “What Do You Do?” Featured in these vignettes are Seniors Jason Tronetti, Cynthia Covel, and Ethan Brammer; Juniors Rebecca VanBuskirk, Lily Torres-Rivera, Kati O’Neill, Cori Lunn, Ellie LaBenne, Anita Germain-Tardieu, and Faith Brownell; and Freshmen Felicity Morrison, Noah Joslyn, Ethan Crandall, Ariel Brizzee, and Tristen Amidon. Three other one acts will also be performed: “Driver’s Test” by David Zolidis featuring Hayden Waldon and Emily Budinger; “Post-Its” by Paul Dooley and Winnie Holzmann performed by Jason Tronetti and Ellie LaBenne; and “Please Have a Seat and Someone Will Be with You Shortly” by Garth Wingfield featuring Kati O’Neill and Noah Joslyn. The cast is working hard and doing a wonderful job. Audiences are sure to be pleased with the outcome!

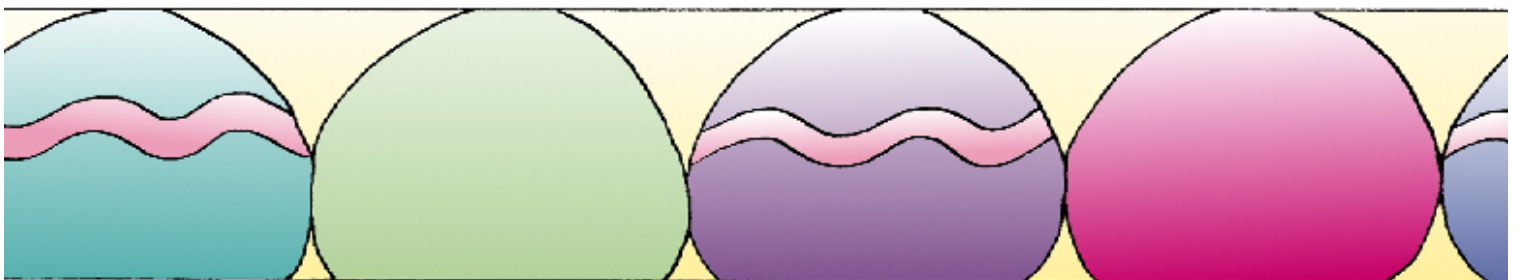

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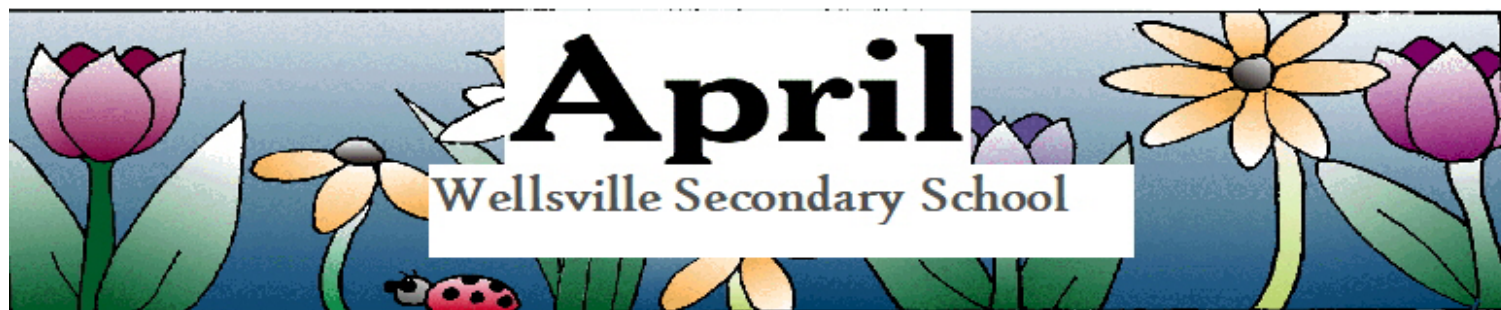
