A Message from the President of the Board of Education & the Superintendent

Dear Residents,

This has been a most challenging year. As we hopefully turn the corner with the Pandemic, we say thank you for your support in allowing for as much in-school instruction as we could safely manage. Our families' support in keeping students home when they didn't feel well, as well as our faculty and staff's support of all of our new safety procedures, were the most important factors in allowing our schools to remain open for inschool instruction.

We would like to announce the decrease of our tax levy for residents by 2% for the upcoming school year (2021-2022). This equates to a levy reduction of \$164,441 in local tax dollars. In addition, the proposed budget amount will also be reduced by 2%. This year's budget (2020-21) was \$32,213,231. The proposed budget for 2021-22 is \$31,568,830. This is a budget reduction of \$644,401. This was largely achieved through equipment expenses for our capital project being reimbursed by the Smart Schools Bond Act (NY State funded). We hope that you will support us by voting on Tuesday, May 18th. Thank you again!




