Elmira College Key Award

WSS is proud to announce the recipients of the Elmira College Key Award, from the Class of 2024, they are Emily Budinger and Haylie Rizzo. The Key Award, sponsored by the Elmira College Alumni Association, has been awarded to fine students since 1935. The award of merit is presented to outstanding high school juniors at the top of their class with a minimum cumulative average of 90%. Candidates must also demonstrate school and community leadership.

A Key Award winner receives an \$80,000 tuition scholarship over a four-year period, \$20,000 per year, upon enrolling at Elmira College. The award is renewable each year with an academic average of 3.0 or higher. Recipients attending Elmira College are also honored in the fall of their freshman year by the Alumni Association and are presented with the prestigious Elmira College Key.

Sage Awards Announced


St. Bonaventure University – Bonnie Scholarship

Reminder to Seniors & Parents

Seniors, please remember to turn in your senior data sheets to the Guidance Office no later than, Friday, April 21st. Blank senior data sheets are available in the Guidance Office or on the school website. These sheets are very important to seniors in order to be considered for any local scholarships. If you have any questions concerning these sheets please see guidance.

More Important Information for Seniors (Class of 2023)

- Complete your Senior Data Sheet carefully and neatly and return it to the Guidance Office by April 21st.
- <u>Neatness Counts!</u> We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be scrupulously honest), and write legibly and neatly in <u>black</u> ink. The <u>Senior Data Sheet</u> is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.
- Please inform the Guidance Office of your post-high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.
- Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.
- Please do not count on local scholarships to underwrite a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books and perhaps a small portion of tuition. You should already have a financial plan in place.
- Do your <u>very best</u> these last few months! Your senior year grades are important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.

Two Vacancies on the Board of Education

The Wellsville Central School Board of Education announces two school board vacancies expiring on June 30, 2023. These vacancies are for three-year terms and will expire on June 30, 2026. Anyone interested in running for the school board can pick up a petition at the District Office located in the Secondary School Complex at 126 West State Street in Wellsville. The petition requires signatures of at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district and must be filed with the District Clerk at least thirty (30) days prior to the budget vote on May 16, 2022. The last day petitions can be accepted is April 17, 2023. Please direct any questions you may have to Megan Burdick, District Clerk at 596-2170.

To qualify for membership on the school board, the following conditions must be met:

- Must be able to read and write.
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- May not be a current employee of the school board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.

Absentee Ballots



Absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk, Megan Burdick, at 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY, at least seven days before the date of the budget vote (May 16, 2023) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or, the day before the budget vote if the ballot is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots may not be mailed by the District Clerk earlier than 30 days before the vote. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY, not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the budget vote (May 16, 2022).

Military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the School District, if they meet the criteria for same. As defined by Education Law 2018- d, military voters may request an application to register as a qualified voter from the District Clerk. Military voter registration application forms must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the twenty-sixth (26th) day before the election (May 16, 2022). A military voter may designate a preference to receive a military voter registration, military ballot application, or military ballot by mail, facsimile transmission, or electronic mail in their request for such registration, ballot application, or ballot. Such designation shall remain in effect until revoked or changed by the military voter.

CURRENT PRE-K STUDENTS DO NOT NEED TO REGISTER

Pre-K: To be eligible to attend our grant funded Universal Pre-Kindergarten program in September 2023 a child must be **4** years old by December 1, 2023. Student spots are limited! If we have more children signed up than allotted slots, we will proceed with a lottery.

Kindergarten: To be eligible to attend our Kindergarten in September 2023, a child must be **5** years old by December 1, 2023.

International Club Field Trip





Students from the International Club, accompanied by Nikki Medler, Sue Ralyea, Karriey Mickle, and Sarah Germain-Tardieu, spent the day in Buffalo on March 1st learning about different agencies that serve the Refugee community of Western New York. Our first stop was to Journey's End Refugee Services, where students were able to meet a brave young man who served as an interpreter for the US military and was able to flee Afghanistan right before the Taliban took over two years ago. Students learned more about life for refugees around the world, many who spend years in refugee camps before being resettled. We ate delicious authentic Indian food (from refugee-owned Alibaba Kebab) before heading to our next stop, Stitch Buffalo. At Stitch, we met refugee women, who through this organization, are trained in various style of textile design and then sell their beautiful handiwork in order to provide for themselves and their families. Our final stop was dance lessons from professional Latin dancer, Fanny Olaya. We learned the basic steps and turns of salsa and bachata. This field trip offered students a firsthand opportunity to learn more about what life is like for so many outside the US. International Club hopes to continue learning more about what we can do to make a positive difference for the refugee community and plans to volunteer with these agencies in the future!






The Wellsville Varsity Cheer team had an excellent season this year. On February 18th, our cheer team traveled to Rochester to compete in Section V Competitive Cheerleading Sectionals. We placed first in our division, and our team was crowned Division 2 Large Section V Champs. The sectional title win qualified the team to move on to the New York State Competitive Cheerleading Championship held in Binghamton on March 4th. This is the first sectional title for Wellsville in Cheerleading.

At the state championship, the varsity team competed against 11 other teams from around the state in our division. After performing their routine, they were selected as "top 5" of the preliminary round. The team performed a second time in a final round and placed 5th in the state. This is an incredible achievement.

Boys Varsity Basketball Section V Champs






The Boys' Varsity basketball program obtained back-to-back Class B2 Section V Titles with a win at the Blue Cross Arena this season. Four players were named to the All-Tournament Team due to their impressive play throughout sectionals. Our Senior Captain, Logan Dunbar, earned Tournament MVP and is one of the few back-to-back Championship Game MVPs Section V has had. Logan also made the Big 30 All-Star Team. This makes five total B2 Titles in the past eight seasons.

Wellsville CSD Robotics

The Wellsville Robotics Teams had an unbelievable showing at the Northern NYS VRC Spin Up Championships on Saturday, March 11th, in Syracuse, NY. This year's State Championship field was comprised of 67 teams from across New York State. All three Wellsville teams were placed in the "Technology" division and established themselves as strong contenders throughout the qualifying rounds, with all teams finishing in the Top-15. Team 14895C (Kamron Dodge, Evan Billings, Caitlin Bittel, Terrence Benz) finished match play undefeated with a record of 7-0 and the #1 overall seed. Team 14895B (Ben Jordan, Lucius Griggs, Cooper Brockway, Ethan Bailey) finished with a record of 5-2, placing them 7th, while Team 14895A (Eli Brophy, Serena Boussa, Hua Qi Zhang, Kavan O'Grady) finished with a 4-3 record placing them 13th.

Team 14895B (Jordan, Griggs, Brockway, Bailey) earned the title of Northern NYS Skills Challenge Champions! The Robot Skills Champion Award is presented to the team with the highest combined Programming Skills (robot is pre-programmed to operate free of driver control for one-minute) and Driving Skills (robot driver operates to score as many points as they can in one-minute). The team edged out perennial powerhouse Lake George by 11 points with a combined score of 268 to qualify them for the 2023 VEX Robotics World Championship! Their programming score was 31 points higher than their next competitor, which proved crucial in holding the top spot. Team 14895B's score at competition saw them ranked as high as 314th in the entire world! Teams 14895A (8th) and 14895C (9th) also had strong showings in the Skills Challenge.

Team14895A (Brophy, Boussa, Zhang, O'Grady) were the Northern NYS Design Award Recipients. This prestigious award also allowed them to secure a spot in the World Championships. The Design Award is presented to a team that demonstrates an organized and professional approach to the design process, project and time management, and team organization. The team's Engineering Notebook and Judges interview demonstrate the team's ability to produce a high-quality

before dropping a close match in the Division Semifinals.

Team 14895C (Dodge, Billings, Bittel, Benz) were exceptional during the entire tournament. After securing the #1 seed in the qualifying rounds, they cruised through the elimination rounds and made it to the division finals before dropping a hard-fought, best-of-three match, 2-games to-1.

Wellsville Robotics finishes the 2022-23 VRC Spin Up season with a total of 13 awards at the Regional level and 2 awards at the State level for a total of 15 awards. The Wellsville Robotics program looks to continue their success at the World Championships in Dallas, TX April 25th-April 27.


