We want to announce that the District will propose another year of 0% tax levy growth for the Wellsville Community. This is the tenth year that Wellsville has presented a budget with no levy growth or tax reduction. We propose this while providing an excellent academic program for our students. The budget for 2023-2024 continues the support for our schools by ensuring outstanding educators, staff, facilities, and programs for our students. The proposed budget allows us to remain a lynchpin for this community.

As shown by their academic achievement, our students have shined, like sending experiments into space from our Secondary and Elementary Schools and investing in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) education and facilities. We have created a new pathway for STEAM students to reach graduation prepared with the technical skills needed for 21st-century careers; we have an awardwinning robotics program and offer premier athletic programs that have won Section V titles in swimming, tennis, cheerleading, and basketball this year and are still looking forward to a competitive spring with Baseball, Softball, and Track and Field. We offer twenty-five extracurricular clubs and activities with diverse tastes to keep our students socially engaged and community-minded. We offer students the opportunity to earn college credit while still in school with the opportunity to take up to twenty-two different college credit-bearing classes. This community provides over \$100,000 in scholarship awards to support our students starting on their various paths. All of these programs began or continue due to this community's support. Medal and Scholarship Program Winner



For many years, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, in conjunction with high schools around the country, has awarded the Rensselaer Medal to high school juniors who have distinguished themselves in mathematics and science. The RPI Medal in Science and Math has been awarded to Benjamin Jordan, a member of the Class of 2024.

The Medal was first presented in 1916 with two purposes: to recognize the superlative academic achievement of young men and women and to motivate students toward careers in science, engineering, and technology.

This \$30,000 per year merit scholarship is guaranteed for four years for each medalist who applies, is accepted, and chooses to enroll at Rensselaer. Rensselaer will be hosting an open house for all medalists in the fall.

Clarkson Leadership & Achievement Awards

Clarkson University would once again like to recognize two top juniors. The juniors selected for the Clarkson Leadership & Clarkson Achievement Awards will qualify for a \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year) or \$48,000 (\$12,000 per year) tuition scholarship, respectively, over four years should the students apply, be accepted, and choose to enroll at Clarkson University. To be eligible for the Clarkson Leadership Award or Clarkson Achievement Award the juniors must be recognized by students and faculty as having been a positive contributor to school and community, demonstrate leadership qualities, be enrolled in a college-bound program, and achieve an academic class rank in the top 15%.





The Board of Education of the Wellsville Central School District, Wellsville, New York, hereby gives notice that an Annual District Meeting on the proposed 2023-24 budget (being Proposition No 1) and related propositions will be held at Wellsville Central School, Wellsville, New York, Elementary School Multi-Purpose Room, 50-98 School St., on the 2nd day of May 2023, beginning at 6:00 p.m.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that a copy of the statement of the amount of money, which will be required for the ensuing year for school purposes, exclusive of public moneys, may be obtained by any taxpayer in the District during the fourteen (14) days preceding May 16, 2023, except Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday, at the following school house in which school is maintained during the hours designated:

Wellsville Central School District Office, 126 West State Street, Wellsville, NY 14895 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education must be filed with the Clerk of the District, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY, not later than 5:00 p.m. on April 17, 2023. The following vacancies are occurring:

- 1. Three (3) year term to expire June 30, 2026, current incumbent. Mr. Alan Mosher:

Each petition must be directed to the Clerk of the District, must be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District, must be filed with the district at least thirty (30) days prior to the budget vote on May 16, 2023, and must state the name and residence of the candidate.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that voting will be held on May 16, 2023, between the hours of

12:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. in the Secondary School Lobby (River Side Entrance) for the voting upon the election of two (2) board members of the Board of Education and to vote upon the acceptance of the proposed budget (being **PROPOSITION NO. 1**) for the school year 2023-24 and:

PROPOSITION NO. 2 RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Wellsville Central School District No. 1 of the County of Allegany, is hereby authorized and directed to purchase two (2) 70 passenger conventional buses at a total maximum cost of \$343,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary to be raised by taxes on the taxable property of the said school district and to issue obligations of the school district, therefore, in accordance with the education law and local finance law.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Wellsville Central School District No. 1 of the County of Allegany, is hereby authorized and directed to increase the annual tax levy an additional \$9,498 and to pay over such funds to the trustees of the David A. Howe Public Library.

PROPOSITION NO. 4 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Wellsville Central School District No. 1 of the County of Allegany, is hereby authorized and directed to:

a. establish a reserve fund pursuant to Education Law Section 3651 to be known as the "General Purpose Capital Reserve Fund-2023" for the purpose of financing, in whole or in part, additions, alterations, renovations or other improvements to existing District's buildings and facilities, construction of new buildings or facilities or the acquisition of lands or interests in lands for District purposes, including the construction, reconstruction or improvement of playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation areas, parking areas, roadways, sidewalks and other site improvements connected to such buildings and facilities and the acquisition and installation of machinery, equipment, apparatus or furnishings required for the purposes thereof, with the ultimate amount

of such reserve fund not exceeding five million dollars (\$5,000,000), plus any accrued earnings on amounts deposited in such reserve fund, the probable existence of said reserve fund being fifteen (15) years, but said reserve fund to continue in existence for its stated purpose until liquidated in accordance with the Education Law, and the sources from which funds shall be obtained for said reserve fund being (i) current and future unappropriated fund balances from the General Fund of the District, as directed by the Board of Education, (ii) appropriations authorized by the voters from time to time, (iii) fund balances transferred from other reserve funds of the District as may be authorized by the Board of Education or by the voters of the District from time to time in accordance with applicable State law, and (iv) state aid, as directed by the Board of Education from time to time.

 b. transfer to said capital reserve fund the entire balance on deposit in said District's existing "General Purpose Capital Reserve Fund-2019" established pursuant to Education Law Section 3651 pursuant to a proposition approved by the qualified voters of said District on May 21, 2019.

AND NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that that applications for absentee ballots to vote on these propositions may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY, at least seven days before the date of the aforesaid district meeting if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before such district meeting if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. A list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued shall be available for public inspection in the office of the District Clerk during regular office hours on each of the five days prior to the day of the vote (excluding Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday) and such list shall also be posted conspicuously at the place of voting. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of such district meeting.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the School District, if they meet the criteria for same. Military voters, as defined by Education Law 2018-d, may request an application to register as a qualified voter from the District Clerk. Military voter registration application forms must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on the twentysixth (26th) day before the election. A military voter may designate a preference to receive a military voter registration, military ballot application or military ballot by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail in their request for such registration, ballot application, or ballot. Such designation shall remain in effect until revoked or changed by the military voter.


